
The policy pledges have been tested and we know they're popular:

Replace the current European system of human rights laws applied in Britain with new British laws that protect rights like free speech but enable the Government to promptly deport illegal migrants.




Reform Equality Laws passed in the mid-2000s with a new system designed to ensure that activist groups are not able to use the law to promote their political agenda.




Cut taxes for families, small businesses and entrepreneurs.

Ban gender ideology in schools and ensure parents' rights to oversee the Sex Education their children receive.

Introduce a legal right for parents to see the Sex Education materials that their children are taught.
